In remembrance: A great leader and dear friend, LTG Tom Rhame passed in June 2023. LTG Rhame was a professional officer and leader who cared for his troops, and our Division. Our Army, our Division, and those who served with him know we have lost a great man. May LTG Tom Rhame rest in peace knowing he made significant contributions while he was on this earth.

I have several "Good News" items to report in this letter:

1. Status of the First Division Monument in Washington DC: Progress!

a. The National Park Service recently approved the final design and specification package for the monument expansion and is working with the White House and Secret Service for approval of the logistics plan to support construction.

b. Concurrently, the Society project manager is in the process of reviewing proposals from selected contractors to begin the construction phase of the project soon after the permit is initiated. We expect to have a construction contractor under contract by mid-November 2023.

c. The Society is still targeting a dedication ceremony for Memorial Day 2024 to honor the 631 BRO Soldiers killed in action in Afghanistan and Iraq; update the Desert Storm plate to the same standards as other plates; and celebrate the 100th anniversary of the

2. A Successful 2023 Society Reunion in New Orleans: The reunion hotel provided a great venue for the 325 attendees to have a good time, and share memories with old and new friends. Our Commanding General brought about 15 NCOs to the reunion and our Veterans enjoyed swapping stories. Cash raffles, and the generosity of winners in giving their winnings to the Society and the DC Monument Fund left us with a net profit of about \$24,000. The Society donated \$5,000 of this to the Monument Fund, with the remainder used to support the 2023 operating budget. As we get a better view of the Society 2023 operating budget, we will decide if more of those dollars could go to the Monument Fund.

3. Future Reunions: Thanks to all who participated in the online survey regarding what to do about future reunions. Your major recommendations were one hotel for all attendees, close to a major transportation hub, and room costs per night as close to \$150 as possible.

a. The 2024 Reunion is at the Clyde Hotel (formerly the Hyatt Regency), in Albuquerque, July 31 to August 4. More details to follow.

b. The Society Board of Directors has approved the following actions:

i. The **2025 Reunion** will be held at Marriott Hotel in Oak Brook,

IL (near the First Division Museum at Cantigny).

ii. A search for hotels in the Kansas City and Washington DC areas for the 2026 and 2027 Society Reunions. Kansas City would include a day tour to Fort Riley; and Washington DC would include day tours to the Army National Museum at Fort Belvoir, VA.

4. Huebner Scholarships: Thanks to the many donors to the scholarship fund. With your generosity, the Scholarship Committee will increase the number of annual scholarship awards to fifteen in 2024. We received a good number of scholarship applications this year; however, only a small number of them were active-duty dependents. We would certainly like to see more children of activeduty BRO soldiers apply and could use your help in spreading the word. Also, we noted the lack of applications to accredited trade schools in this year's submissions. As a reminder to all, the scholarship program also applies to those wishing to attend an accredited trade school. The application process for submissions is the same packet format for both paths of education.

Please encourage those eligible to apply for scholarships in 2024. Thank you for supporting your foundation.

5. Post 9-11 BRO Veterans: We continue to seek ways to reach out to this important era of the Society. I am seeking your ideas on the

following concept of communicating, primarily with Post 9-11 BRO Veterans but really aimed at all BRO Vets. Concept: The Society would designate a member or group of members as the state coordinators for Society matters. They would use social media to establish networks with BRO Vets living in their state; provide press releases to appropriate state media offices regarding Society activities; post notices of BRO Society Reunions / key events in VFW and Legion Halls; and establish other initiatives appropriate for their state. The Society Executive Director would assist by providing information to the state coordinators and respond to their questions.

I continue to be optimistic about the future of our Society. However, we need new approaches to reach out to Post 9-11 BRO Veterans to explain the Society objectives and encourage their participation. They are the future of our Society.

In summary, I ask that you continue to keep **BIG RED ONE** active-duty members in your prayers. They continue to deploy globally, accomplish missions in support of our freedom, and serve as great ambassadors of the United States of America!





Letter from the CG by Major General John V. Meyer, III



Dear Big Red One Soldiers, Families, and Friends,

What a wonderful time of year to be a resident of the Flint Hills region. The fall foliage and the incredible landscape grant us inspiring views, reminding us that Fort Riley is an amazing place to call home. With the change in seasons comes a rigorous glide path for the Division as we prepare for our Division level command post exercise this winter, deploy the Combat Aviation Brigade, support multiple gunneries, and celebrate the conclusion of the "Year of the NCO."

Fort Riley and the 1st Infantry Division remain a focal point for key leaders across the Army and the State of Kansas. We hosted visits by the FORSCOM Commander, Sergeant Major of the Army, both United States Senators for the state of Kansas, and most recently the Secretary of the Army. Their visits highlight our incredible formations, schools, and community support.

The Division had all the unit colors uncased on the Cavalry Parade Field early this fall, signifying the Division being home and together for the first time in over two years. We welcomed home 2nd Brigade who, over the last nine months, worked closely with allies and partners to train forces and enhance interoperability across Eastern Europe. Our Soldiers were instrumental in the combined arms training of Ukrainian Soldiers and formations. We are incredibly proud of the team as they tackled a rigorous training plan and set conditions for the success of Ukrainian forces.

Concurrent with the uncasing of the colors and welcoming home of the 2nd Brigade, we cased and farewelled the 1st Combat Aviation Brigade. The Brigade will execute a nine-monthlong tour in Europe, providing world-class support and continuing to represent Fort Riley and the 1st Infantry Division in Europe. Our Soldiers will make a difference, and we remain proud of their commitment to the mission and support of our allies.

In addition to our operations in Europe, the 1st Division Sustainment Brigade is preparing units for deployment to the Middle East. The Brigade remains engaged with deployment and redeployment operations, continually supporting the Division while completing rigorous training to build on their expertise as a combat enabler.

The booms you hear across the Flint Hills is our 1st Brigade conducting training and completing their gunnery qualifications on Tanks, Bradleys, and Paladins. Over the next six months, the Division will complete multiple iterations of gunnery across the two combat brigades; our Soldiers and leaders are engaged in tough, realistic training to ensure we are fit to fight and win our nation's wars. As we close out the year, we will commemorate the "Year of the NCO" with a winter formal ball. This year, we focused on the "Backbone of the Army." The Division hosted multiple panels, ceremonies, and guest speakers over the last year to highlight our incredible NCO Corps. We are honored to have SMA (R) Daniel Dailey as the guest speaker for the ball and look forward to next year's focus, the "Year of Victory."

Request for Help

Dear 1st Infantry Division Vietnam Veterans,

I served with the 1st Infantry Division in Vietnam in combat with the 1-18 Infantry, Company D, Mike Platoon, 2nd squad. My job was a Point man. I was wounded on November 11, 1969, tripping a hand

grenade booby-trap. The VA sent a letter out years ago that the heaviest sprayed area of Agent Orange in Vietnam was Core 111. I have type 2 diabetes and stage 3-4 kidney disease, connected to Agent Orange.

In 2014, I was tagged with bone cancer, called

Chondroplasty Osteosarcoma. The VA says it's not connected to Agent Orange. My cancer has traveled from my left leg to my lungs, and in 2019 it went to my thyroid. It's a rare cancer, especially traveling to three parts of the body.

I'm looking for anyone

Stronghold Community Food Bank Partnership

The Society of the First Infantry Division recently partnered with Stronghold Community Food Bank to deliver perishable food items and dry goods to military families on Fort Riley. Monica Bassett, Founder and CEO of Stronghold, contacted Executive Director Phyllis Fitzgerald to initiate a partnership and collaboration. Together with Stronghold, we will be reaching out into the local communities to reach military families who live outside Fort Riley.

Food aid delivered to Fort Riley families today

June 7, 2023 -- The organization "Stronghold" is expanding its operations to Fort Riley in partnership with The Society of the First Infantry Division to aid the one in four military families facing food insecurity.

Monica Bassett, Founder and CEO of Stronghold, delivered \$50 worth of nonperishable groceries and \$75 worth of basic necessities to Fort Riley families in need today. Phyllis Fitzgerald (CW3 Retired) and Executive Director of the Society of the First Infantry Division and Bassett purchased fresh protein and produce, dairy items, and bread for the community to ensure nutritious foods are available for patrons. Through this partnership, military families will be able to stock their shelves and refrigerators to alleviate food stress during the summer, according to Fitzgerald.

Basset said, "We are grateful that the Society of the First Infantry Division is linking arms with Stronghold to stand in the gap to ease the burden of this silent crisis within our military community."











Task Force Centurion (1-34 Armor) 20th Anniversary Reunion

In September, Veterans, Soldiers, family members and friends of 1-34 Armor gathered at Fort Riley for the 20th Anniversary of their deployment to Iraq. This deployment was the first for the 1st Infantry Division as part of Operation Iraqi Freedom and lasted one year starting in September 2003, in the al Anbar Province of Iraq. Over 200 Veterans and family members attended the anniversary, the first time the unit had gathered since returning from the deployment.

Events included an open house and static display on Fort Riley, sponsored by 2-34 Armor, and a dinner sponsored by the Junction City American Legion Post. A formal memorial service was held to honor the 23 lives lost during the deployment.

The reunion allowed members of the unit to reconnect, share stories, and remember the sacrifices that were made two decades ago. Initial plans are already underway for a 25th Anniversary Reunion in 2028.

Phyllis Fitzgerld (Executive Director of the Society of the First Infantry Division) gave an update regarding getting the 631 Post 9/11 names added to the First Division Monument. She advised the Society will be using all means available to get the word out on the date of the unveiling of the names and the new Desert Storm plaque.













Medal of Honor

Capt. Larry Taylor Awarded Medal of Honor

On September 5, President Joe Biden awarded the Medal of Honor to Army Captain Larry L. Taylor (Retired), Vietnam Veteran and Life Member of the Society of the First Infantry Division.

Taylor received the medal for his heroic actions on the night of June 18, 1968. Flying a Cobra attack helicopter, Taylor saved a 4-person Long Range Reconnaissance Patrol (LRRP) team that was surrounded by the enemy and out of ammo. He did so at considerable risk to his own life. In fact, the Army said that what Taylor pulled off had never been tried before.

A 1st Lt. at the time, Taylor was serving in D Troop (Air), 1st Squadron, 4th Cavalry, 1st Infantry Division. He flew over 2,000 combat missions in UH-1 and Cobra choppers, stationed in Vietnam from 1967 to 1968.

Taylor, now 81 and living in Tennessee, is the Big Red One's 38th recipient of the Medal of Honor, the United States' highest military award for valor.

We are all proud of Capt. Taylor for his remarkable service to our country and fellow Soldiers. He truly lived up to the motto, "Leave No Man Behind."




The monument will be placed in Victory Park next to the 1st Infantry Division Headquarters.

First Division Monument

The First Division Monument - Washington D.C.

The monument was conceived by the Society of the First Division to honor the valiant efforts of the soldiers who fought in World War I. Located on the corner of 17th and E streets, NW, in the shadow of the White House, the monument was constructed in 1924.

• The center pillar, erected after World War I, contains the names of the Division's 5,516 killed in the Great War.

• The West Wing was dedicated in 1957, with the names of the Division's 4,325 killed in World War II.

• The East Wing was dedicated in 1977 with the names of the Division's 3,079 killed in Vietnam.

Monument Construction Summary

The basic design of the First Division Monument in Washington DC will not change. Granite pillars, similar to those already holding plaques listing those lost in WWII and Vietnam, will be added, • In front of the Vietnam Wing, a tablet was dedicated in 1995, with the names of the Division's 27 killed in Desert Storm Gulf War, including the first female soldier and the first civilian.

The United States Congress has approved adding the names and units of 631 First Infantry Division soldiers killed during Operating Iraqi Freedom (439) and Operation Enduring Freedom (Afghanistan) (192); and provide space for future conflict BRO KIAs.

Planned modifications to the monument:

• Add granite pillars to hold the plaques containing name, rank and unit of each KIA from Operation Iraqi Freedom,

along with the BRO KIA name and

631 Soldiers Who Made the Ultimate Sacrifice

In an April 2017 memorandum, the First Infantry Division Commander established the policy for adding names to the First Division Monument in Washington, DC.

Criteria: Department of Defense service member and civilian names may be added to 1st Infantry Division monuments when their deaths occurred in the line of duty (or equivalent circumstances for civilians) while assigned, attached, or belonging to 1st Infantry Division Training and Readiness Authority units during overseas deployment service or their deaths occurred as a result thereof. Names of civilian contractors may not be added to 1st Infantry Division monuments. Qualification for adding names of fallen personnel to monuments will be interpreted broadly to mean incident to overseas service, rather than narrowly to mean direct combat engagement with an enemy.

The Department of the Army approved the 631 names on 19 October 2021.

Each name is listed with rank under the unit they were serving. They include not

only those assigned to the First Infantry Division, but those from units attached to the First Division during combat operations. Examples:



Susan Eisenhower Visits Cantigny

Susan Eisenhower headlined September's Date with History, the First Division Museum's acclaimed lecture series. Addressing a packed house, she discussed "How Ike Led: The Principles Behind Eisenhower's Biggest Decisions."

The book, published in 2020, is a retrospective of Dwight D. Eisenhower's wartime and presidential years. "How Ike Led" is part leadership book, part history and part memoir with new insights on the man that only a family

member could offer. Eisenhower, granddaughter of the 34th U.S. president, is a policy analyst, business consultant, speaker, and writer with over 30 years of experience in national security, leadership, and related strategic issues. She is chairperson emeritus of the Eisenhower Institute and founder of The Eisenhower Group, Inc, a Washington, D.C.-based consulting company.

First Shot by the First

October 23, 1917, is a significant date in our beloved Division's history. That day, at 6:05 a.m., the First Division fired its first shot at the enemy in World War I. The soldier responsible was Sergeant Alexander "Alex" Louis Arch from South Bend, Indiana, serving with Battery C of the 6th Field Artillery Regiment. His post-war portrait, shown here, is part of the First Division Museum's extensive photograph collection.

Born "Sándor Ács" on March 19, 1894, in what is Romania today, the Great War veteran immigrated to America with his family in 1903, anglicizing their names upon arrival. He enlisted in the Army in 1913 and rose to the rank of Sergeant during the Mexican Border War.

Before the Mexican conflict ended, Arch was heading overseas with the American Expeditionary Forces aboard the S. S. Henry R. Mallory in July 1917, to begin training for the battles to come. Just a few months later, on that historic day in October, Captain Idus R. McLendon, Commander of Battery C, yelled "Fire!" Arch was the first to pull the unit's French 75mm lever sending the explosive into the enemy-occupied territory of Xanrey in northeastern France.

Arch was awarded the Silver Star and Purple Heart for his actions during the war and continued to serve with the Division until 1923. He returned to South Bend after his service, settling down and raising a family.

The man who fired the first shot passed away on December 9, 1979. He was 85.

All five generations of Arch's family have served in a branch of the military. Alex III is currently the steward of his grandfather's uniform and the casing from that first shot fired.

A BRO Nurse Returns

Col. Jodelle M. Schroeder and her family visited Cantigny in July to tour the museum and view personal artifacts she donated in 2014. A decade earlier, Schroeder served with the 1st Infantry Division as a battlefield nurse in Iraq. She was a commissioned Army Nurse Corps officer at the time, with the rank of Captain. She enlisted with the Corps in 1997 and still serves today, currently assigned as the Deputy Corps Chief of the Army Nurse Corps in Falls Church, Va. Schroeder generously donated a complete field uniform and several pieces of medical gear to the museum, along with some archival artifacts. Her uniform and medical bag are displayed in the museum's Duty First gallery in the "Women in Combat" section.
