
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A U.S. First Division Artilleryman in the doorway of his bombproof shelter utilizes a few peaceful moments in writing to the folks at home. March 7, 1918.

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

Letter from the President By LTG (Ret.) Ron Watts



Your Society is making great progress. Monument expansion construction is underway; planning is in full swing for our Albuquerque reunion (July 31-August 4); and the Society continues to support our 1st Infantry Division soldiers and their families, thanks to your generous donations.

First Division Monument

Expansion: I am delighted to report that ground breaking has occurred and construction is underway in Washington. Our construction contractor sees very low risk in having this project done in early May 2024. Major points:

• Granite plinths to hold the bronze plaques containing the 631 names of BRO soldiers lost in Post 9-11 operations (Afghanistan: 192; Iraq: 439) and replace the existing plaque listing Desert Storm KIAs—are being mined from the granite quarry.

• The current estimated cost of this project is \$1,050,000. We have raised \$985,000 to date, including a very generous \$500,000, plus fifty cents matching on all other donations, from the Robert R. McCormick Foundation, which operates the First Division Museum at Cantigny (Wheaton, IL). Society members have been quite generous with their donations as well, and I thank you! For those who have not contributed, if you have \$20 or more available, you can help us over the finish line. See the donation form in this issue of Bridgehead Sentinel. I am confident we will reach our goal.

• The Society will provide further updates via email and social media.

Reunion: The theme of our 2024 gathering in New Mexico is "1st Infantry Division – Year of Victory," celebrating the accomplishments of the officers, NCOs, and soldiers who have served in the "Big Red One."

• Best days to attend are Friday and Saturday, with a Thursday arrival. Main events: Conflict Breakfast beginning at 0730 on Friday. Annual Board meeting is 2 pm on Friday. Saturday events: Memorial Service at 0900 followed by the General Membership Meeting. Reception at 6 pm followed by the annual banquet at 7 pm.



• We need your help in advertising this Reunion, especially to BRO Post 9-11 veterans. I encourage you to offer news releases to your local newspaper, radio and TV stations, and your VFW and American Legion posts.

• Note: you must do two things to register. First, complete the registration form and send to the Society. Second, call the Clyde Hotel to make your room reservation. Full details are in this issue.

Huebner Scholarships: These are competitive scholarships for children, grandchildren and great-grandchildren of veterans who served in the 1st Infantry Division of the United States Army, as well as children of active-duty soldiers of the division and attached units of the 1st Infantry Division. Specifics:

• Scholarships are open to any accredited university, college or trade school. The award is currently for up to \$15,000, payable to the school in four annual installments of not more than \$3,750 per year.

• The Society has added a new category for Trade School Scholarships. We encourage those eligible that are seeking to learn a "trade" apply.

• Scholarship applications are due by May 15, 2024. See details on the Society website, www.1stid. org.

Our 1st Infantry Division remains busy, and a key part of our national security. The soldiers continue to make us proud by living up to the Division Motto: No Mission Too Difficult, No Sacrifice Too Great, Duty First!

I continue to be optimistic about the future of our Society. I am proud of the way our members stepped up and helped raise almost \$900,000 to honor the 631 BRO soldiers who made the ultimate sacrifice in Afghanistan and Iraq by adding their names and units to our First Division Monument in Washington, DC.



Society of the First Infantry Division Member Profile Update

Our database is refreshed daily by either updating a profile, taking a membership payment, creating a new account, or looking up a member in response to an inquiry.

Data indicates that Post 9-11 era membership as passing the Vietnam era. Given the current composition of our member database, our general fund operates on approximately 5% of member annual dues. The remainder of the Society annual budget is supported by funds from business partners, corporate sponsors, quartermaster sales, donations, and fundraisers.





In Memoriam

General Gordon R. Sullivan (Ret), 1937-2024

Just after 2024 began, we received the sad news of a great soldier's passing. Gen. Sullivan, who served as president of the Society of the First Division from 1996 to 2003, died on January 2 at age 86. Below, Andrew Woods, research historian at the First Division Museum at Cantigny, provides a look back on Sullivan's extraordinary life of leadership and service.

Gen. Gordon R. Sullivan was born in Boston on September 25, 1937. He graduated from Norwich University in 1959, earning an ROTC commission as a 2nd Lieutenant of Armor along with a B.A. in history. He would later receive master's in political science from the University of New Hampshire.

Sullivan's first assignment after Norwich was with the 2nd Armored Division. His initial overseas tour was Korea, 1961-62, followed by two combat tours in Vietnam starting in 1963. His career overseas assignments also included four tours in Europe.

In 1975, LTC Sullivan commanded the 4th

Battalion, 73rd Armor, 1st Infantry Division (Forward), in Germany. He was later appointed Chief of Staff, 1ID(F). He left the Big Red One for a year in 1977 before returning as Assistant Chief of Staff, G-3 (Operations), 1st Infantry Division at Fort Riley, through 1979.

For a year beginning in 1988, MG Sullivan served

as Commanding General, 1st Infantry Division. REFORGER 1988 in West Germany prepared 1ID soldiers for large-scale operations.

Army Chief of Staff Gen. Carl Vuono promoted Sullivan to 3-star Lieutenant General and Deputy Chief of Staff for Operations in 1989. Just one year later he received his 4th star and a promotion to Army Vice Chief of Staff.

In 1991, Gen. Sullivan was appointed the 32nd Chief of Staff of the United States Army—the senior general officer in the army—and a member of the Joint Chiefs of Staff. He held this position until his retirement on July 31, 1995.

Speaking at Gen. Sullivan's retirement ceremony, Secretary of Defense William Perry remarked: "I've known many of our military commanders from WWII, Korea, Vietnam, and Desert Storm. I know of none bolder than Gordon Sullivan ... He is an intellectual whose superb mind is tempered with uncommon common sense ... I know of none who are better leaders... He will be missed greatly."

After retiring from military life, Gen. Sullivan spent two years in the business world before joining the Association of the United States Army (AUSA) as president in 1998. He led the organization for 18 years, adding the title of CEO along the way. "Gen. Sullivan was a true American hero and an Army legend," said retired Gen. Bob Brown, AUSA president and CEO. "As the 32nd Chief of Staff of the Army, he led the service through critical times with strength and a clear vision, ensuring soldiers and their families had the best training and resources."

Gen. Sullivan cofounded the Marshall Legacy Institute in 1997 and served as president (and later board chair) of the Army Historical Foundation. During his time as chairperson, he led the successful capital campaign to build the National Museum of the United States Army at Fort Belvoir, Va., which opened in 2020. Also in his post-Army life, Sullivan applied his remarkable intellect in becoming a leading authority on the national security implications of climate change, chairing the CNA Military Advisory Board.

At the 1996 BRO Reunion Gen. Sullivan was unanimously elected president of the Society. He passed the presidential torch to LTG Thomas Rhame at the 2003 reunion.

Throughout his life, Gen. Sullivan remained devoted to his alma mater. He served on the Norwich board of trustees for many years, and chaired the university's board from 2003-2006. Gen. Sullivan's awards and decorations included the Distinguished Service Medal, Defense Superior Service Medal, Legion of Merit, Bronze Star, Purple Heart, Army Commendation Medal (with Oak Leaf Cluster), Meritorious Service Medal (with Oak Leaf Cluster), and Combat Infantryman Badge.

In 2021, speaking in his hometown of Quincy, Mass., Gen. Sullivan remarked, "There's nothing like being in a uniform and serving the United States of America. I have told many people, if I could do it again, I would. And I am not kidding."


Brigadier General William J. Mullen III (Ret), 1937-2024

BG Mullen, who served with the Big Red One for nine of his 33 years of active duty, passed away on February 11, 2024, in Carmel, Calif. He was 86.

A second-generation Army officer, BG Mullen graduated from the U.S. Military Academy in 1959. He went on to command the 1st Infantry Division (Forward) in Germany and deployed with them to Saudi Arabia during Desert Storm.

BG Mullen first deployed to Vietnam in 1962, returning there in 1966 as a BRO soldier. That year, on August 25, then-Captain Mullen distinguished himself while serving as company commanding officer during a combat operation in Binh Duong Province. He received the Distinguished Service Cross for his heroic actions and devotion to duty.

also a Ranger and Master Parachutist.



Beyond the battlefield, BG Mullen's military career included staff positions at the Pentagon, U.S. Central Command in Tampa, and U.S. Forces Command at Ft. McPherson, Ga. He was In addition to the Bachelor of Science degree he received at West Point, BG Mullen earned a master's of Foreign Affairs from George Washington University, awarded while he was a student at Naval War College in Rhode Island. He also graduated from Army War College in Pennsylvania.

After retiring in 1992 as Brigadier General, Mullen spent 10 years developing training material for the U.S. Army as a civilian contractor. From 2015 to 2016, he served as National Commander of the Legion of Valor, America's oldest veterans service organization comprised of recipients of the two highest honors for valor in combat.

In addition to the Distinguished Service Cross, BG Mullen received the Combat Infantryman Badge, the Expert Infantryman's Badge, two Distinguished Service Medals and two Soldiers Medals.

Remembering a Friend



Joan Hicks Creighton passed away peacefully on March 17, 2024, at age 91, in Prairie Village, Kansas. She is remembered fondly, especially at Cantigny (Wheaton, IL), where she was director of the Robert R. McCormick Museum and Public Affairs, from 1986 to 2000. During that time Joan's husband, Major General Neal Creighton, served as president and CEO of the Robert R. McCormick Foundation, Cantigny's "parent" organization. General Creighton, who died in 2020, was Commanding

General of the 1st Infantry Division at Fort Riley from 1982 to 1984. Joan leaves behind daughters Linda, Lisa, and son Neal, along with many grandchildren and great-grandchildren. The Society and Cantigny extend their condolences to the entire Creighton family.






Society News

Monument Construction Summary

Construction is underway! Thanks to all who have contributed to this important task of adding the names and units of the 631 Big Red One soldiers killed in Iraq and Afghanistan.

The basic design of the First Division Monument in Washington DC remains unchanged. Granite plinths, similar to those already holding plaques listing those lost in WWII and Vietnam, will be added, along with the BRO KIA name and unit on plaques mounted on top of the pillars. The existing Desert Storm plaque will be replaced with one matching the existing plaques. All of these will be located where it says "proposed monument" in the artistic rendering below. Additional granite plinths will be added to accommodate BRO KIA in future operations as indicted by "future expansion."



Individual names, along with their units will be displayed by OIF, OEF, and Desert Storm mounted on top of the granite plinths. Example plaques are below.



We were fortunate that the quarry that provided the granite used for previous monument updates is still open. The construction contractor was able to match the new granite needed for the bases with the older granite. The bronze plate containing the names and units are complete, as is the new version of the Desert Storm bronze plate.

The contractor has a high degree of confidence that the monument expansion will be complete by mid-May 2024.

We have now turned our attention to a monument expansion dedication ceremony, and have tentatively selected Sunday, May 26, at 11 am, for the event. We are awaiting Secret Service and National Park assurance that we can conduct the ceremony at the monument, not from a distant field. We envision a one-hour ceremony, with Gold Star families in attendance. When details are finalized we will inform Society members via email and social media.

We are still raising funds to complete construction with a projected need of \$75,000. Thanks to all who have contributed. 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

From their harrowing landing on Omaha Beach and on through the treacherous French countryside, soldiers of the U.S. Army's 1st Infantry Division pursued nothing but victory. This summer, the First Division Museum at Cantigny commemorates the extraordinary events of D-Day, June 6, 1944.

Nothing but Victory

Members of the Society are cordially invited to experience a first-of-its-kind exhibit that could only be possible on the grounds of Cantigny here in Wheaton, IL. Opening to the public on June 6, the 80th anniversary of D-Day, "Nothing but Victory" combines art and history to tell a captivating visual story of the "24 hours that changed the world."

Working with exhibit partner Bridgewater Studio, First Division Museum curators have assembled a compelling diorama across the Cantigny landscape, simulating the man-made and topographical features that 11D soldiers encountered in Normandy.

The first 300 yards of the exhibit take visitors across Omaha Beach, a strand featuring sculptures and metal silhouettes of soldiers, troopships, a landing craft, "hedgehog" obstacles, and tethered barrage balloons. Interpretive signs paint a picture of the chaos and extreme peril on the beach as our soldiers advanced with enemy fire raining down. Profiles of actual soldiers are included.

A popular Cantigny attraction called Butterfly Hill represents the high bluffs that soldiers on the beach risked their lives to ascend. At the top, visitors will find a captured German "pillbox" draped with a giant American flag.

The exhibit trail then leads into the French hedgerows, where D-Day soldiers continued their determined surge in the name of freedom.

"Nothing but Victory" concludes in the courtyard behind the First Division Museum. There, visitors will gaze into mirrors creating the illusion of an endless row of white crosses, approximating the Normandy American Cemetery and Memorial in Colleville-sur-Mer. The museum courtyard features a replica of Spirit of American Youth Rising from the Waves, the bronze statue in the center of the Normandy memorial.

Inside the museum, a complementing exhibit highlights the D-Day experiences of seven well-known personalities (see adjoining article).

Special tours and lectures honoring the 80th anniversary of D-Day are scheduled this summer as well. Please visit the events calendar at *FDMuseum.org* for details.

Compelled to Serve

A second, must-see D-Day exhibit is inside the First Division Museum. "Over Land, Over Sea, Overlord" highlights the experiences of well-known personalities. As the shadow of war loomed large, men whose names were synonymous with fame and accomplishment were compelled to contribute to the fight against oppression.

The special summer exhibit explores the personal stories of seven famous men-turned-soldiers, revealing a profound intersection of celebrity and sacrifice. Their actions during Operation Overlord are an enduring testament to the indomitable human spirit and the universal call to defend liberty in the face of adversity.

The featured servicemen are Yogi Berra, James Doohan, Medgar Evers, Sam Fuller, Bobby Jones, David Niven, and J.D. Salinger.

Welcome, Kevin West

Lieutenant Colonel (Retired) Kevin West has joined the Robert R. McCormick Foundation as Military Liaison. This part-time position was created to steward the Foundation's relationship with the greater 1st Infantry Division community, including active-duty soldiers, military families, the Society of the First Infantry Division, veterans of the Division, and Division leadership at Fort Riley, Kansas. West will advise McCormick and Cantigny leadership, Cantigny being an operation within McCormick, on subjects relevant to the military community.

With a 20-year background as a Big Red One soldier, officer, and civil servant, West will be an asset to the Foundation in our work with veteran service organizations, grantmaking, and employment/training initiatives, as well as other engagements important to the community. He will also support the First Division Museum at Cantigny, providing advice on collections, exhibits, and programs.

Before retiring from the Army in 2009, West distinguished himself as a field artillery officer, serving in Operations Desert Storm and Iraqi Freedom with the Big Red One, and taking part in missions in Bosnia, Kosovo, and Iraq with other U.S. Army units. His military career reached its high point when he took command of the 1st Infantry Division's 1st Battalion, 5th Field Artillery Regiment, known as the Alexander Hamilton Battery.

West earned a Bachelor of Science in Criminal Justice from Missouri Western State University and a Master of Science in Personal Financial Planning from Kansas State University. His military education includes the Field Artillery Officer Basic and Advanced Courses, the Army's Command and General Staff College, and the Defense Language Institute Foreign Language Center's German language program.

A resident of Manhattan, Kansas, West is active in community service. He is engaged with the military and veteran communities as the treasurer for the Officers of the First Division and is a founding board member and current president of the Armed Forces Community Foundation, an affiliate of the Greater Manhattan Community Foundation.
